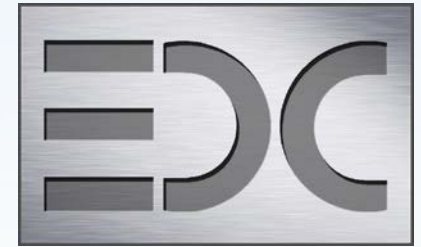

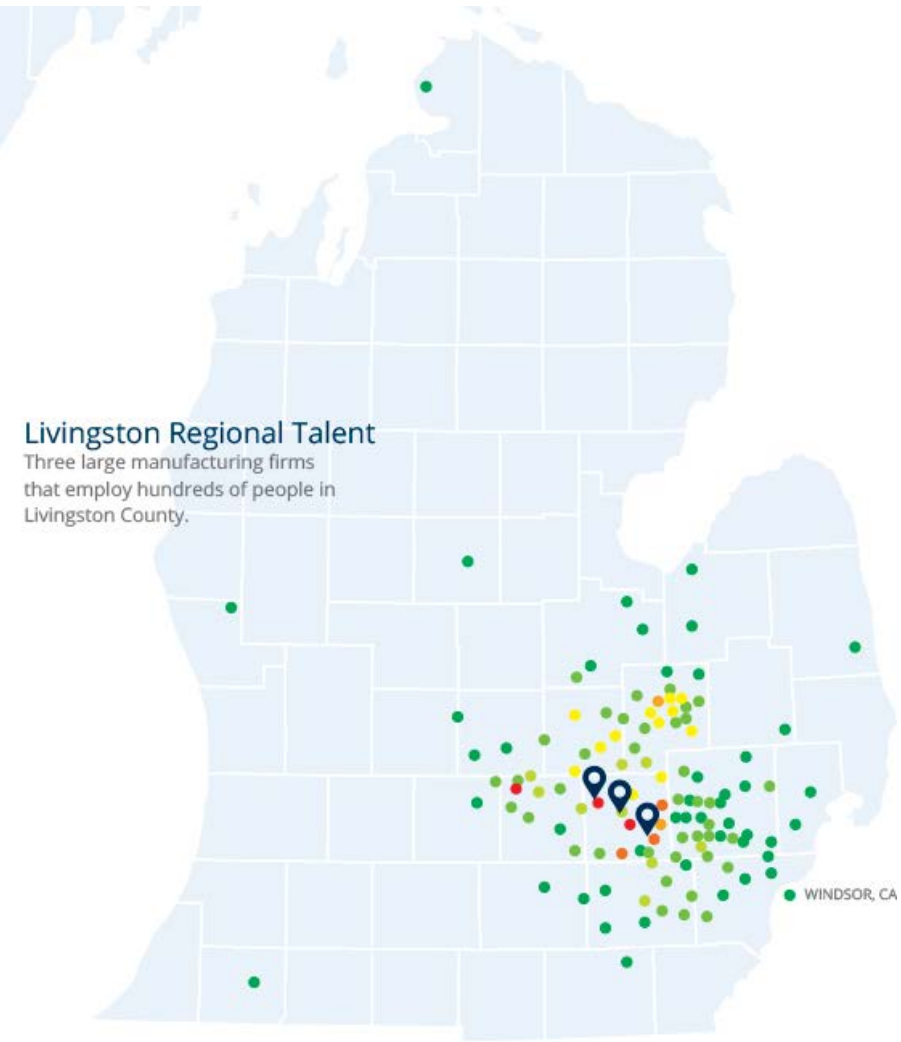
Budget per resident for Economic Development in MI

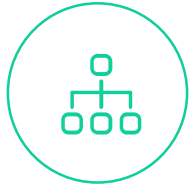

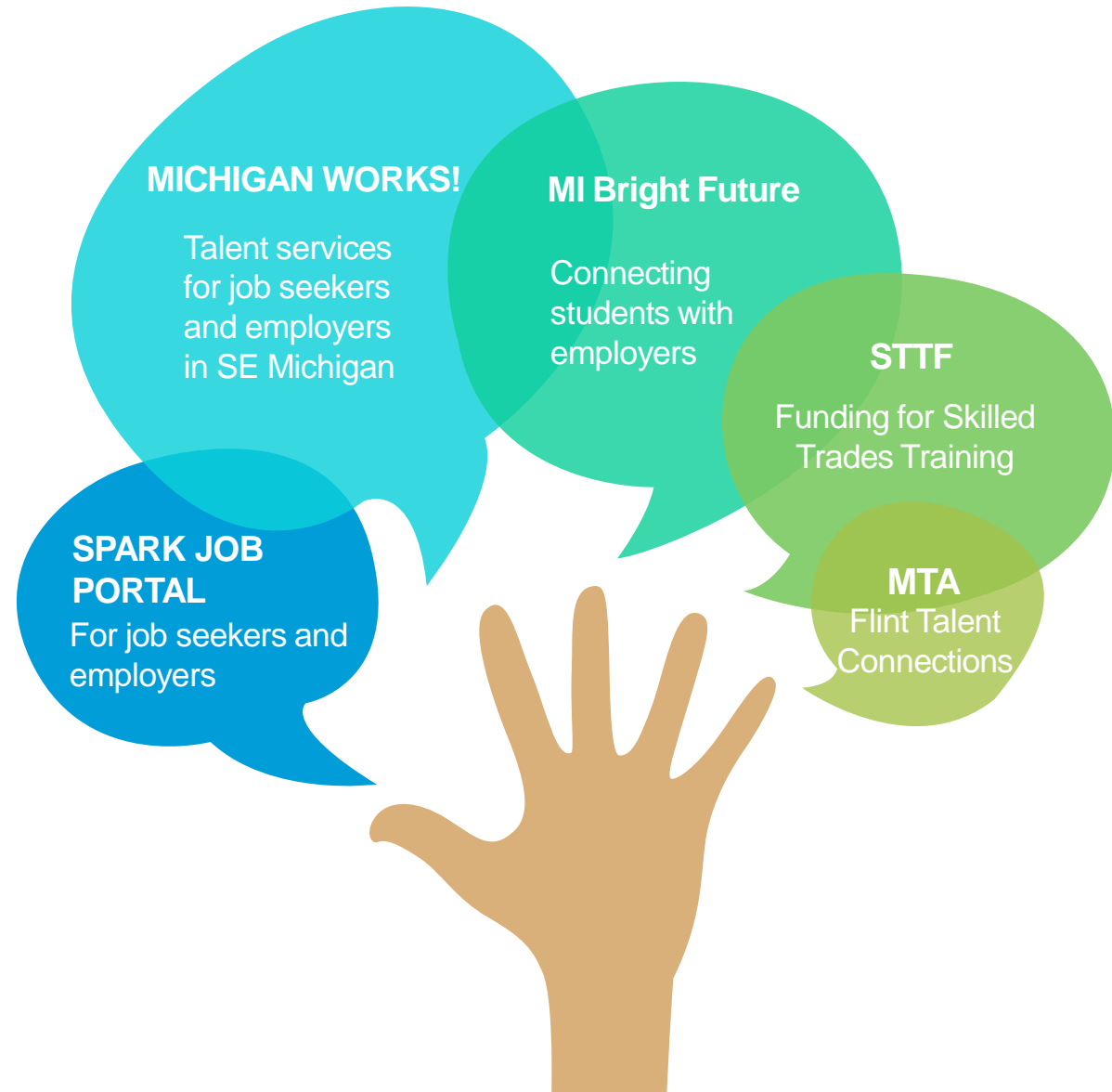

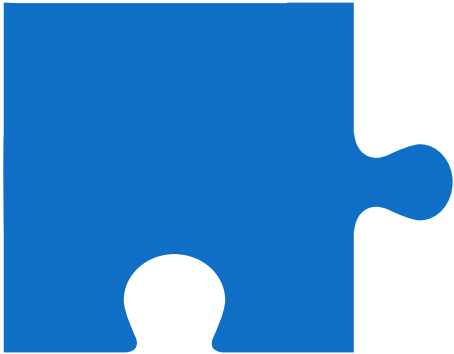
SPARK's staff works closely with a wide range of partners to ensure our workforce is trained to meet the needs of the community.

- Governor Rick Snyder recently released a list of **Career Pathway** recommendations to address the talent needs of employers

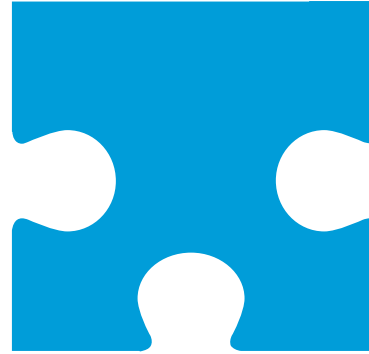

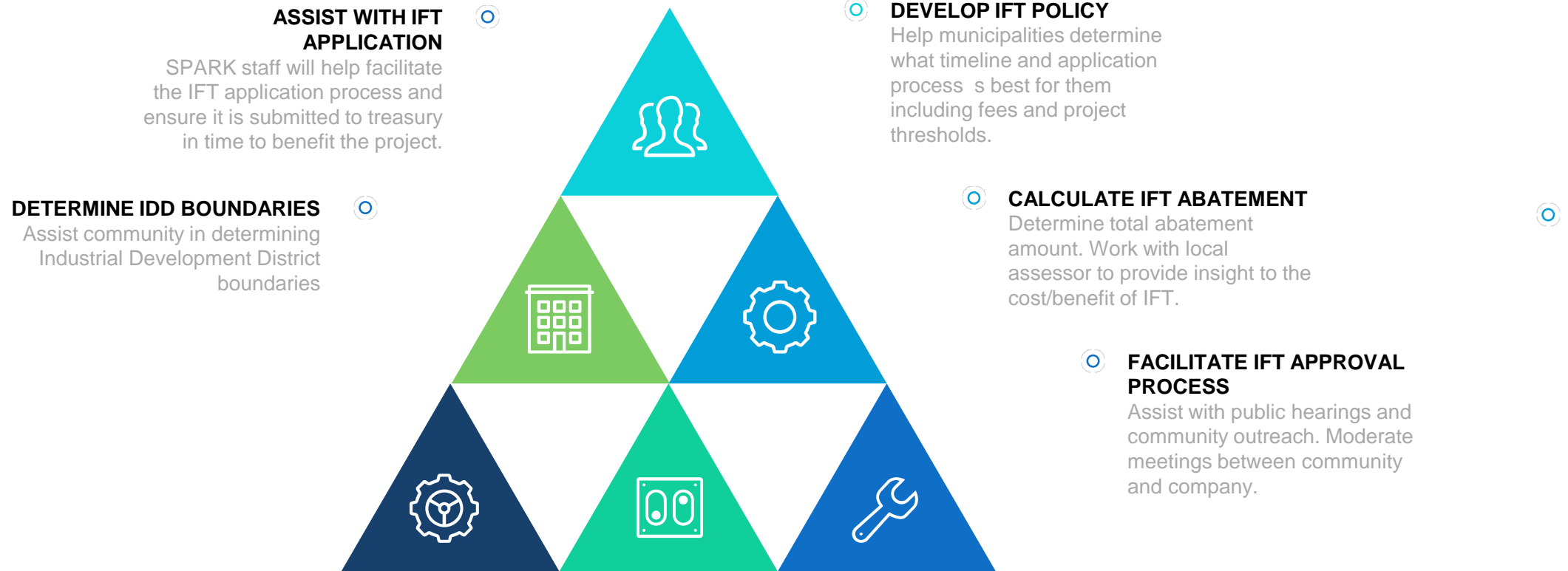

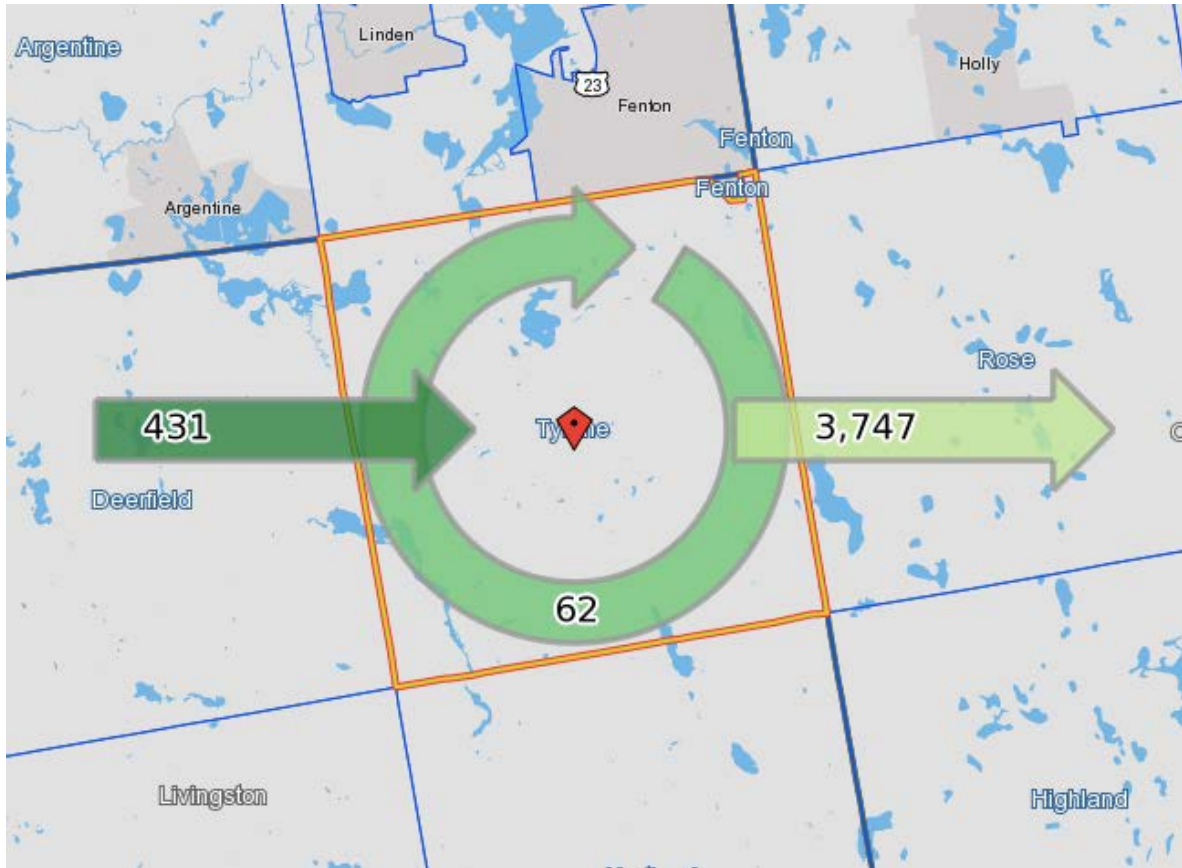

Tyrone Township is a bedroom community

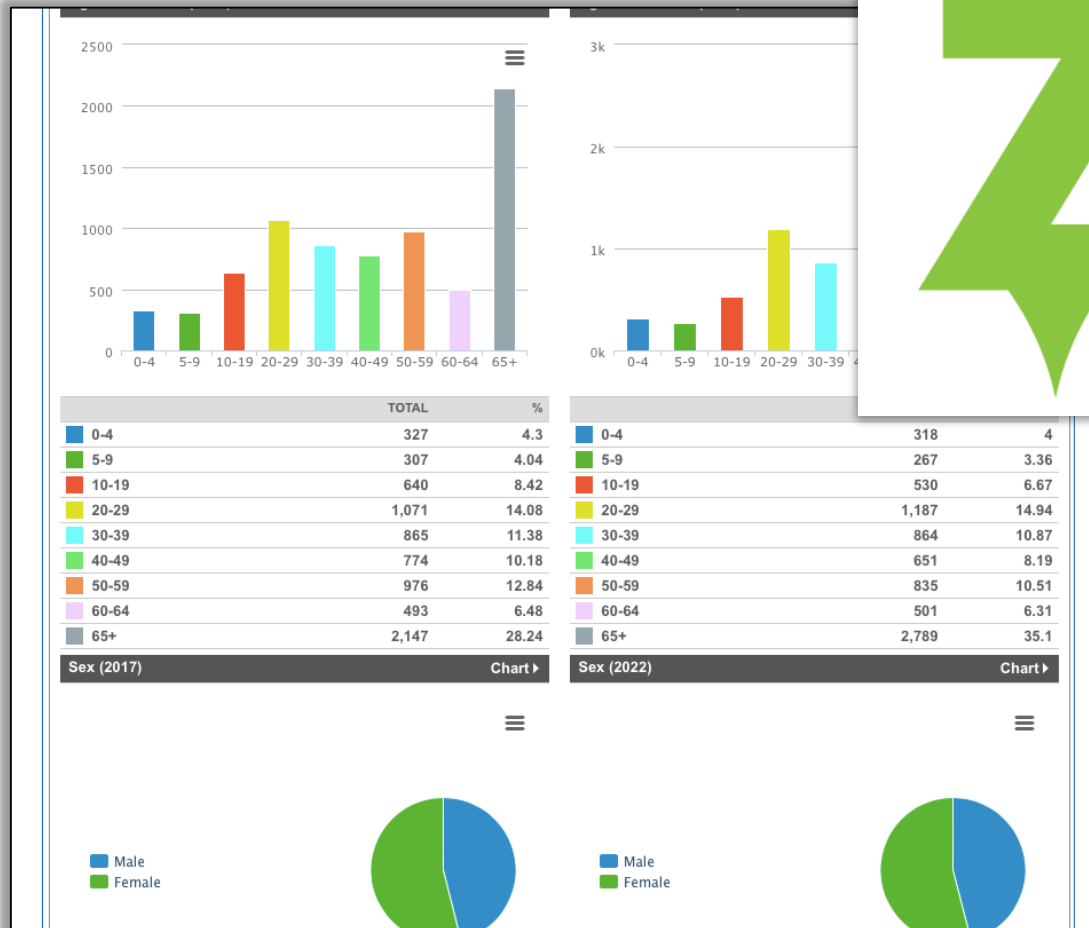
98.4% of Tyrone Township residents commute outside of the Township for work.

ECONOMIC ANALYSIS



TALENT

The local job market does not adequately serve residents with a Bachelor's Degree or higher

Focus business attraction efforts on companies with high-wage and high-skill opportunities



LAND USE

Livingston County lacks "shovel-ready" greenfield sites for large job-creating projects

Identify potential barriers for large job-creating projects and develop strategies to mitigate them



BENCHMARKING

Workers who are employed in Livingston County often reside elsewhere. Residents who live in Livingston County often work elsewhere.

Develop strategies to reduce the commuting burden for workers and residents.

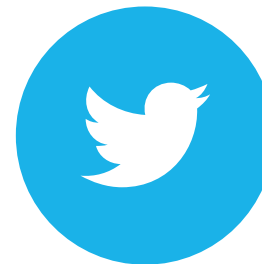
